FROM THE PASTOR

*Laudetur Jesus Christus! Gelobt sei Jesus Christus!
Sia lodato Gesù Cristo! Praised be Jesus Christ!*

Today we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent as part of our preparation for Christmas. While not penitential in nature like Lent, the themes of sacrifice and preparation are still prevalent. A reminder that if you brought your Advent Wreath to Mass, please bring it up to the Communion Rail after Mass to be blessed. Please find this brief reflection from Peter of Blois on the nature of Advent and what it is that we are preparing for. After that, please find re-printed some notes regarding the pandemic from last week. To that, I wish to add, if you are not feeling well, please do not come to Mass that particular day/weekend. That is both a matter of charity and justice to your neighbor. Thanks!

"There are three comings of our Lord; the first in the flesh, the second in the soul, the third at the judgement. The first was at midnight, according to those words of the Gospel: At midnight there was a cry made, Lo the Bridegroom cometh! But this first coming is long since past, for Christ has been seen on the earth and has conversed among men. We are now in the second coming, provided only we are such as that He may thus come to us; for He has said that if we love him, He will come unto us and will take up His abode with us. So that this second coming is full of uncertainty to us; for who, save the Spirit of God, knows them that are of God? They that are raised out of themselves by the desire of heavenly things, know indeed when He comes; but whence He cometh, or whither He goeth, they know not. As for the third coming, it is most certain that it will be, most uncertain when it will be; for nothing is more sure than death, and nothing less sure than the hour of death. When they shall say, peace and security, says the apostle, then shall sudden destruction come upon them, as the pains upon her that is with child, and they shall not escape. So that the first coming was humble and hidden, the second is mysterious and full of love, the third will be majestic and terrible. In His first com-

ing, Christ was judged by men unjustly; in His second, He renders us just by His grace; in His third, He will judge all things with justice. In His first, a lamb; in His last, a lion; in the one between the two, the tenderest of friends." - Peter of Blois

This is just a reminder and re-print of what I had in the bulletin last week. A quick note, as we have grown lax in many of our pandemic observances. First of all, please be aware of how you are presenting yourself for Holy Communion. It is growing increasingly difficult to administer Holy Communion to some based on how your head is positioned and how your tongue is extended. Your head needs to be gently set back and your tongue flat and extended. Masks are not to be worn at the time of receiving Holy Communion. They should be removed when the priest arrives at you at the rail. This helps to prevent the Host from falling to the ground.

Secondly, I again remind everyone that there should be no gathering in front of the church to talk. While I understand many of you do not see each other throughout the week, at this time this is not possible. This causes quite the stir in the neighborhood; we have been reported several times to the health department and the Archdiocese. The administration of the Sacraments is of the utmost importance. Unfortunately, continuing to disregard the mandates of the state and my simple requests put that at risk. So please observe the very few things that we have asked of you. We have to consider our priorities and if certain things are worth more than others. Is having a conversation after Mass worth the possibility that Mass could be canceled again? We can disagree with the mandates, and we can show our displeasure at the ballot box, but in the end, there is an authority who can take all of this away again. So I ask you to please meditate upon that.
